Door Prize: Won by Marcia Hunter


Show and Tell: Plants were shown by Eileen Hart, Mike Sweet, Dave Johnston, and Marylynne Jones

I regret to inform you that Al Muzzell passed away Sunday, December 11, 2011. He died at the Gainesville VA Hospital after suffering from cancer and other complications. His interment was conducted by the VA at the Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Bushnell, Florida on December 14, 2011.

Al was one of our regular speakers at BGTB and always willing to share his plants and knowledge of bromeliads with anyone who would listen.

He was a founding member of the Gainesville Bromeliad Society and served as President many times. He also served as Chairman of the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies and was instrumental during the early years of the Evil Weevil research, in aiding Dr. Howard Frank in locating weevils and their pupa from the Central American forests to be used in the University of Florida research labs.

Al will be missed by all who knew him.
