Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay will hold its regularly scheduled meeting on

Monday, November 19, 2012

Speaker will be Dr. Terrie Bert from Sarasota, Florida.

She will be discussing bromeliad family genus Orthophytums to Pergas.



In this talk, Dr. Bert will discuss groups of bromeliad genera according to the habitat (s) they inhabit in nature. We'll journey through the many beautiful New World habitats where bromeliads live and learn about some adaptations bromeliad genera have made to enable them to thrive in those habitats. This journey will take us from the ocean's edge and seasonally flooded lowlands to the highest and driest desert in the world. In this overview, we'll see ways in which bromeliads enrich ecosystems while adding beauty to the surroundings.

Background: Dr. Terrie Bert is a longstanding member of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society (SBS) and the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society and has held multiple offices in the SBS. She also served the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies (FCBS) as a representative and officer for eight years. For the Bromeliad Society International, she has been a Florida Director and chaired several international committees. She currently is Librarian, Curator of the Wally Berg Award of Excellence, and an internationally accredited Master Judge. She's given over 100 presentations on bromeliads to numerous U.S. and international bromeliad societies and other groups. She has authored articles for the BSI Journal and the FCBS newsletter. She cultivates approximately 2,000 different bromeliads in 24 genera. She's won multiple top awards in local bromeliad shows and BSI world conferences and is a volunteer for and contributor to the BSI Bromeliad Identification Center.

Terrie has a Ph.D. in marine biology and is a research scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Her hobbies also include SCUBA diving.


Directions to Meeting Location

Bromeliad FAQ

When should I remove the new plants forming around the original?

Bromeliads can start forming pups at any time, but most start pupping after they bloom. These pups are ready to be separated when they reach about 1/3 to 1/2 the size of the parent plant. If the pup is starting to form roots, that's a good indication that the plant can survive on its own. Pups may be removed by cutting with a sharp knife or clippers as close to the mother plant as possible.

The longer you leave the pups on the mother plant the quicker they will reach maturity (taking nourishment from mom). Feel free to trim back the leaves of the parent plant if they start interfering with the growth of a pup. Alternatively, taking the pups a bit smaller will encourage the mother plant to throw more pups sooner. It depends on whether you want a bunch of plants (for bedding or to share with friends) or if you just want a few that will mature quicker. If you are in a colder climate you may want to wait until spring time to remove pups that would otherwise be ready to remove in the winter as pups don't usually root well when it's cold. Alternatively, if you have a number of evenly spaced pups around the mother, you may opt to cut away the mother plant and let the pups form a clump.
