Member Service Recognition Award

This year during the Holiday Party two people were named recipients of the FWCBS Service Recognition Award with tributes made on their behalf by members Marty Baxley and Alton Lee, and a guest, Herb Hill, owner/operator of Hill's Raingreen Tropicals in Lithia, FL.. Each recipient's name has been inscribed on a separate bronze plate that will be added to the list of past honorees on a plaque at the Florida Botanical Gardens. Both of the honorees were nominated by Helga Tarver.

The first honoree is <u>Henry Rahmlow</u>, who retired to Florida in the 1950s at a time when bromeliads were not well known and were hard to find. His interest in a variety of plants soon brought him to bromeliads and to FWCBS where he was intensely active and contributed much to advance the Society's goals. As his bromeliad collection grew, his plants won ribbons in shows, and he generously sold many of them at nominal prices to members and the public at large. He initiated the FWCBS newsletter, which was the first newsletter for any bromeliad society in the US. As its editor, a position he maintained until his passing in April 1980, he brought much-wanted horticultural information to the readers.

The second honoree is Andy Price who joined the FWCBS in the mid-1970s. He has promoted our Society's



goals in numerous ways. He pushed us to get involved in local plant sales and served as Sales Committee Chairman for many years. In his growing career, he hybridized numerous bromeliads, many of which have yet to be registered, and has educated us through his various workshops on growing bromeliads, including hybridization and

growing them from seed. He was also one of the driving forces behind our society's displays at three of the World Bromeliad Conferences (1980, 1992, and 1996), two of which won first prize (1980 and 1996). Andy recently sold his bromeliads and greenhouses to Marty Baxley, so, he has essentially retired from growing but it is likely he will keep his hands in the bromeliad world.
