#### **Member Service Recognition Award**

President Kathy Risley announced that this year's recipient of the FWCBS Service Recognition Award is Helga Tarver, and Dennis Cathcart and Alton Lee paid tribute to her as part of the award presentation. Helga has been a member of our society for about 30 years during which time she has served almost continually as our Historian, Librarian, and in-house bromeliad expert, positions well suited to her vise-like memory and laser-sharp mind. While most know her for her love of and expertise in Tillandsias, she is also passionate on the subjects of bromeliad taxonomy and hybrid registration. Over the years she has corresponded regularly on these subjects with recognized experts such as Derek Butcher, the former BSI Bromeliad Registrar, and the late Harry Luther, and she has done so without benefit of a computer and the internet, using



instead a manual typewriter and the US Postal Service. With her vast knowledge of bromeliads she is a person our members, and others, often go to for bromeliad identification and horticultural information. One of her goals is to encourage hybridizers to register their new plants, and in some cases she will register them for the grower. In his remarks, Alton also recognized her husband Tom for facilitating and supporting her participation in the world of bromeliads and, thus, her impact on that world.

On the left is a blooming *Billbergia* 'Poquito Más' from this editor's garden that is a tetraploid (see discussion in the December 2012 newsletter.) As you can see, the extra pair of chromosomes in this polyploid has resulted in a more vigorous plant, with more vibrant color and larger flowers than the same hybrid that has only the usual two sets of chromosomes.
