Dennis Cathcart is going to tell us about the grand opening of Singapore's Gardens by the Bay he attended this summer and the part his firm Tropiflora Nursery played in supplying over 300,000 plants for the gardens. In July 2010 while the gardens were still under construction, he made a presentation to our group and told us how he and Tropiflora were working with the gardens, and he showed us drawings of some of the planned features in the gardens. Now the gardens are finished and open to the public, and he will show pictures he took at the opening that record how the plans for the gardens were realized.

LAST MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Program: Members' Showcase

The Members' Showcase program of six short workshops/presentations was informative and enjoyed by all. Susan Sousa had it well organized and members moved through the room visiting each workshop at timed intervals. A lot on information was disseminated in those intervals. Presenters and their topics were as follows:

- Barret Bassick: Navigating the FCBS Website. Barret talked about how best to utilize this website, which is a great resource for bromeliad lovers. This was particularly informative for our newer members and a good refresher for our older, or rather, more established members.
- Marty Baxley: Hybridize and Grow Bromeliads from Seed. Using props and handouts, Marty showed his hybridizing method and provided a lot of information in the short time allotted.
- Dave Johnston: Force-blooming Bromeliads. Dave demonstrated how to use a commercial product, Florel® (ethylene gas in a liquid formulation), to induce bromeliads to bloom sooner than the cycle Mother Nature typically allows. This is handy for commercial growers with upcoming sales and hobbyists who plan to enter a blooming plant in an upcoming show.
- Gary Lund: Thorns, Thorns, Thorns...Why? Gary is known for his love of the thornier bromeliads (such as Hechtia and Dyckia) and he talked about their appeal, care, and feeding, and how to defend oneself when dealing with them.
- Linda Sheetz: Preparing a Bromeliad for a Show. Linda talked about desirable features for a bromeliad that is being entered in a judged show and how to prepare a plant to enhance those traits. She showed

plants with winning traits, plants with less than desirable traits, and plants that really should have been left at home and not brought to a show.

Larry Sousa: Creating a Bromeliad Database. Larry showed the Excel spreadsheet database he
designed to catalogue his bromeliad collection. He had a file of photographs of the plants that he can
cross-reference with the database file.
