Regardless of what the rhyme says, April traditionally is a dry month in this area. It's a little too late in the year for those cold fronts that are preceded by rain and it's a little too early for the afternoon thunderstorms that we become accustomed to in the Summertime. I don't usually spend a lot of time during the year watering my bromeliads. In the Summer the frequent rains pretty much take care of that and in the Winter they don't really need that much water. It's in the Springtime though that I take pity on them and turn the sprinkler system on at least once a week. The humidity is often fairly low during this time of year and it can get quite windy -combined, plants can become dessicated very quickly. Perfect conditions for another knickname for Spring in Central Florida – the Fire Season! In fact, we really have three distinct seasons: Fire Season, Hurricane Season, and the Killing Cold Season...or at least that's how the news media tend to present it.

This month's meeting -

The topic for discussion this month is the letter C. I'm pretty sure that there aren't a lot of us growing varieties of Catopsis, although I find this to be a very interesting little Genus. Instead we'll have a discussion and Show and Tell centered around that other Genus

beginning with "C" – that much maligned group, the Cryptanthus. Maybe it's their lack of a showy inflorescence?...but then you could say the same for Neoregelias. Or, maybe it's the name itself – it doesn't roll off the tongue nicely like the Genus Tillandsia or Aechmea. And, there's that puzzlement over the plural of the name. What should you call two or more plants from this group – are they Cryptanthuses, Cryptanthie, or simply Crypts? That last choice has a negative connotation in itself – as a grower of these little plants, are you now a "Crypt Keeper"? For whatever the reason, I hear Genus-related slurs directed toward the Cryptanthus family more often than any other group in the Bromeliaceae family. Sometimes you hear it at a sales table "oh, that's just a Cryptanthus – what other bromeliads do you have for sale?" and sometimes it's from an experienced bromeliad grower "that's just a Cryptanthus that's not a real bromeliad". It's enough to give a Crypt-Keeper an inferiority complex! Despite it all, this group of bromeliads (yes, a Cryptanthus is a real bromeliad!) enjoys a growing following among bromeliad enthusiasts and I think we're all looking forward to the International Cryptanthus Show at the Plaza Hotel in Daytona Beach on November 5th of this year.


