Charlotte Mueller's Aechmea Perez was not in bloom in time to bring to the April meeting for "Show and Tell", but she sent this picture to share with us showing the pendant bloom as well as a nice healthy pup - that will be ready to not bloom in time for next year's April meeting! All kidding aside, Aechmea Perez has an interesting story associated with its development. A patent was established for a hybrid cross of Aechmea racinae x Aechmea Victoriana var. discolor by none other than Mulford Foster way back in 1949. He registered it as Aechmea Foster's Favorite. Scoot ahead a few years and a California hybridizer by the name of Ed Hummel took an interest in Aechmea Foster's Favorite and carefully selected out the darkest clone of the offsets from that plant. By continuing this selection

process over the course of 17 generations of Aechmea Fosters Favorite, Hummel wound up with a nearly black, thin leaved plant that he named Aechmea Perez.
