Dave has been growing Bromeliads for 32 years now and is the owner of Bromeliads Galore, a collector’s nursery in Pinellas Park. He is past president of the Tampa Guild 5 times and the West Coast Society twice. He has pretty much served in every capacity of the clubs including Florida Council representative.


I won't be at the August meeting. See you at our September meeting.
