



# SIX MILE CYPRESS SLOUGH PRESERVE FIELD TRIP

It was March of 2004 when Rosemary Fleming last guided us through the Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve in South Fort Myers. Another tour is being organized to occur on November 5th. Even if you attended the last field trip, the environmental conditions dramatically change with the seasons. There will be a different diversity of birds, animals and flowering plants visable in the Fall compared to the Spring during our walk.

The raised walkway meandering through the Reserve is perfect for seeing the vast majority of the Park without getting wet or eaten (unless or course it rains or you get fed to the alligators for making too much noise). Wear loose fitting clothes, comfortable walking shoes or sneakers, a hat, bug spray will probably be needed, bottled water and your camera.

CBS is a financial supporter of "The Friends of Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve". We are also very fortunate to have Rosemary Fleming who was recently honored for her work as a mentor, bythe Florida Native Plant Society, as a member of <u>our</u> Society. She is a Naturalist-guide at the Preserve and she has agreed to give our Society another special tour of the Preserve.
