PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO BY LAWS OF FLORIDA COUNCIL OF BROMELIAD SOCIETIES, INC.

ARTICLE X - SEC. 1-A. Rules and procedures governing management of Florida International Bromeliad Shows, hereinafter referred to as FIBS.

Section 1-A-1: General

- A. Dates for FIBS shall be set 3 years in advance by the host society with the approval of the Council. Exceptions shall be made only by a majority of Council members in regular session. Affiliate societies who are members of the Council shall be required to honor date selections for FIBS by not scheduling local shows within ten days before or after the FIBS date.
- B. Actual operation of FIBS shall be subject to rules set up by the host society with the following exceptions:
 - 1. Judging shall be in accordance with the "Handbook for Judges & Exhibitors" as published by the BSI.
 - 2. Hybrids of unknown parentage shall not be eligible for major awards except as follows: a. "Grandfathered" by Hybrid Ident. List of BSI.
 - b. In process of registration but not yet published by BSI.
 - 3. Plant sale rules shall apply to all Florida Bromeliad Societies (and their individual members) equally.
- C. To be eligible to host the FIBS, a Council member society shall have staged a minimum of two local standard bromeliad shows, as defined by the above "Handbook" with one show accomplished before application and two shows before actual date of the FIBS.

Section 1-A-2: Financing.

A. Awards. The Council shall either purchase or reimburse the host society for all top awards and other ribbons for FIBS and this expense shall not be a factor in determining profit/loss of the show; provided, however, that no top award shall exceed in price that of a BSI un-mounted medallion, in which case the excess over the medallion price shall be borne by the host society. Special catagory awards shall be financed by individual

subscription and the awarding thereof at the option of the host society.

B. Profit and/or loss from a designated FIBS shall be shared equally by the Council and the host society. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chairman of the Council to work with the host society in all matters concerning a FIBS and file a final written report with the Council at a regular meeting prior to the close of his/her term of office.

Section 1-A-3: Adoption. Adoption of this amendment shall be in accordance with Article XII and VIII, Sec. 1-A of the existing by-laws.

Additional proposed changes to existing by-laws:

ARTICLE VI, Section 2. Change to read:
"Senior members shall assume office for one year at
the opening of the <u>first</u> regular meeting of the calendar year etc." Presently reads: "Senior members shall
assume office for one year at the close of the <u>last</u>
regular meeting of the calendar year etc..."

also...ARTICLE VI, Section 4. Change to read:
"All out-going officers shall deliver to their successors all records and materials relative to their office at the opening of the <u>first</u> regular meeting, etc" Presently reads: "All out-going officers shall deliver to their successors all records and materials relative to their office at the close of the <u>last</u> regular meeting of the year".

Notice of change of Registered Agent of Florida Bromeliad Societies, Inc. charter number 742703, State of Florida. Article XIII. The initial registered office of this corporation shall be: 3961 Markham Woods Road; Longwood, Florida, 32750, and registered agent shall be: Carol M. Johnson. Presently, charter shows registered office at 609 Limona Road; Brandon, Fl. and agent as Bob Puterbaugh. To facilitate certification of non-profit status for mailing purposes, it is important to have address of registered agent the same as that of the publication.

NEW ON FLORIDA SCENE - Neoregelia marcelli Pereira & Moutinho n. sp. Subgen. neoregelia. Type: Estado do Rio de Janeiro, Serra do Itatiaia, Maua. Leg. Marcelo Correia de Araujo no. 9, 13 February 1980. Holotype HB no 70.660.

Related to N. fosteriana L.B. Smith this new species is readily distinguished in the apex of the leaves, in the white corolla and in the scape, also related to N. lymania R. Braga & Sucre, from which it differs in the color of the corolla, in the margin of the leaf limb, in the size of the sepals and in the shape of the floral bracts. It is dedicated to Marcelo C. de Auaujo who discovered it and whose love for plants made him deserve this homage.

A blooming specimen was sent to Harry Luther at the Selby BIC in the spring of 1982, and he identified it as the above species. With the identification he received color prints, about which he remarks: "bracts and sepals in photos are red; corolla appears very pale blue-lavendar, nearly white. Foliage green."

Original plant came into my possession in 1977, as one of a few survivors of a shipment from Lotus Osiris, Brazil, untagged. First flowering passed unnoted, as it was languishing under a bench. When I did notice it, my guess was that it might be Aechmea nidularioides. Texture of the leaves and their shape in no way resembles Neoregelia, looking more like Aechmea victoriana v. discolor than anything. In my greenhouse the leaves flush rosy red. The plant pups freely, and like it's relative Neo. pineliana, is somewhat tender. A blooming specimen will be on display at the State Show in Orlando in September. The plant seems to have no set blooming season, as one bloomed in February, and another is coming now. I believe the discoverer is the same "mad Brazilian" (somebody else's characterization) who brought Hohenbergia correi-araujei to the 1980 World Conference in Orlando.

The hybridizers will have fun with this one.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Vicky Chirnside

FCBS met at the home of Terry & Roberta Virta, Naples, F1. on Saturday, July 10, 1982. Host society, Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society.

Societies represented: Broward, Caloosahatchee, Central Florida, Florida West Coast, Imperial Polk, Jacksonville, Sarasota, Seminole & Tampa. Absent: South Florida.

Minutes of previous meeting approved as corrected. Treasurer's report showed a balance of \$1,066.69. Old Business:

Grande: No report but will have final by next meeting.

Council Newsletter: H. Quilhot moved, seconded by Ed McNulty to have Carol Johnson pursue the non-taxable status for mailing. Some societies have not paid their newsletter assessment for this year. Reps of the various societies are to take payment request back to their boards.

Speaker's Roster: T. Musleh reported no replies other than the same names already on the list.

Multi-Media Library: T. Musleh reported that sets are in process of being put together which will consist of 80 slides with tape. The tentative price would be \$20.00 of which \$10.00 would be refunded on return of the program. She states she has a number of unidentified slides, which will be shown at the next council meeting to see if reps can help in identification. Central Florida Society has donated slides to the library.

State Show: Ed McNulty moved, seconded by R. Schoenau amending motion to move location of 1982 State Show from Selby Gardens, Sarasota, to Winter Park Mall, September 24-26, hosted by Bromeliad Society of Central Florida. Motion approved.

New Business:

BSI Affiliates President Meeting in Corpus Christi: Reported that there is going to be a reorganization of the BSI Board and Committees for better rapport with the affiliates. They would like affiliates to push to get more of their members to join BSI.

Presentation of Life Membership in BSI to Valerie Steckler, Judging Instructor: Vote at Corpus Christi was confirmed.

By-Laws Changes: Carol Johnson presented a change

in FCBS By-Laws as pertains rules governing the annual FCBS State Show. It was discussed and some changes made, and will be brought back for final voting at the next meeting as required by the existing By-Laws.

1983 State Show: T. Musleh moved, seconded by Bill Frazel to hold 1983 State Show in Jacksonville on May 6-8 at Orange Park Mall. Motion approved.

1982 Awards, State Show: Ed Hall moved, seconded by Ed McNulty that Florida Council shall purchase or reimburse the host society for ribbons and top awards not to exceed \$500.00 and top award price not to exceed the cost of BSI medallion. Motion approved.

Next council meeting will be held in Tampa on October 9, 1982. Meeting adjourned.

Folia c. 15-20 rosulata, ligulata, utriculum infundibuliformem efficientia, omnia cum limbis viridibus;vaginis ellipticis 10cm longis, 5-7cm latis, integris, utrinque purpurascentibus et lepidibus brunneis adpressis obdectis; limbis basi paulo an gustatis, in apicem versus sensim etiam angustatis et in acumen tenue exeuntibus, superne inconspicue lepidotis, subtus dense et nitenti albo lepidotis, margine spinis haud ultra lmm longis dense armatis. Scapus 9cm longus, albus, internodiis 5mm longis leviter albo lepidotis; bracteis scapalibus 6 imbricatis, ovali-triangularibus, serrulatis, albis et utrinque dense albo-lepidotis, 3-4cm longis, 3cm max. latitudine, apice longe acuminato, acumine 5mm longo subpungente; bracteis primariis ovato-acuminatis, 35mm longis, 15mm latis, purpureis, exterius dense albolepidotis, interius leviter lepidotis.
