35.00 (Waterfront)


These rates are for a double room for up to 4 persons and the motel has a lounge, dining room and swimming pool.

#### DON'T LET THE BIG ONES GET AWAY

In the early days of my collecting "sickness" -- the late sixties, early seventies -- just finding any bromeliads to buy was a real problem. Even my gardening books failed to list them. The only advertisers in the Journal in those days was a centerfold listing of commercial growers. From that source I was able to secure catalogs from two growers in Brazil and from Oakhurst Gardens in California (Mr. Giridlian). There were no descriptions, just plant names and prices. Remember, in those days we did not have the Padilla book nor Monograph 14 (Vol. 1 came out in 1976). My first mail order plants were Acanthostachys strobilacea and Dyckia fosteriana 'Silver Queen' purchased from Oakhurst Gardens. I still have the Acanthostachys, but in ignorance I divided the Dyckia and it died almost immediately. When Mr. Giridlian died Oakhurst Gardens went out of business and that left me with only the Brazilian sources.

It was quite an adventure placing and receiving an order in those days. One of the catalogs contained pictures but no clue as to the size of the pictured plant. If the name sounded good and the price was right, I ordered. In due time the plants arrived, were potted and tagged. As it has turned out, it was a case of the blind leading the blind. I thought the plants received were as ordered and, presumably, the supplier thought what was shipped was correct. Actually, over the years, it has been quite an adventure getting my Brazilian plants correctly names. Hohenbergia castelanosii (ordered as Hoh. stellata) grew and bloomed in my greenhouse years before it was officially discovered and named. A plant ordered as Aechmea fernandae has turned out to be a very pretty and select form of Ae. phanerophlebia. The Streptocalyx floribundus grew and grew and grew to about four foot across. After 15 years and a stiff shot of Florel it finally bloomed and turned into a huge, unidentified Hohenbergia.

With the passing of the years, publication of some good books and the creation of BIC, our Florida bromeliad growers have become more erudite. Sadly, that has also meant that fewer people are growing the big plants and they are disappearing from cultivation. Space for the big plants is at a premium. However, we have discovered also that plants which we thought had to be big can be controlled by underpotting and holding back fertilizer. There are some that take a tremendous amount of time to mature, and then bloom fleetingly and are often a big disappointment. It is very hard to love these and give them room, but somewhere out there is somebody who would like to have one, so let's not let them disappear.

My list of scarce, big plants follows. I have confined it

to the Bromelioideae subfamily, but there are also some large Hechtias and Dyckias which are also disappearing.



# ACANTHOSTACHYS pitcairnioides

This addition to the formerly monotypic genus is being seen more often in collections and in shows. It was pictured on the back cover of the Journal, July/August 1989 issue, but the picture does not do the plant justice. Here in Florida the plant has dark red foliage, black teeth and small, brilliant blue blossoms at the base of the plant. It forms clumps very easily, is about 15 inches tall, and is a desirable addition to any collection. Culture is the same as Acan. strobilaceae.

# BUSINESS MEETING July 14, 1990

The regular meeting of the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies was held in Miami at the home of Eileen and Nat DeLeon. Thank you to our host and hostess.

The secretary's report was read and approved as such.

The treasurer's report was passed out to the group for comment and was also passed, motion made by Carolyn Schoenau and seconded.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Reproduction of rare plants- Selby Gardens still has the commercial labs and needs to eliminate dealings with them before they can do only research. Nat has checked out the possibilities of using other commercial labs for this purpose and the cost is too prohibitive and the number of labs has been substancially reduced in the last few years. A follow up letter is being sent to Selby Gardens letting them know of our continued interest should circumstances change in the future.

BIC PLaque at Selby Gardens- Selby Gardens is not interested in a BIC Plaque because there is not a place for one and they basically feel that the public won't look at one. They suggested possibly that we put a plaque on Harry's office door. New possibilities are to donate materials directly to BIC to assist Harry Luther in his work. A committee of Ron Schoenau, Tom Wolfe & Carl Perryn will check out and pursue this further.

#### NEW BUSINESS

1990 EXTRAVAGANZA- Each rep will be responsible for getting 3 plants for the auction. There will be a featured speaker. Flyers will be sent out to all members of the Florida Council to share with the members of their various societies. There was some discussion about getting a speaker for this year's Extravaganza and a motion was made by Narda Enander to authorize Ed Hall to use up to \$100.00 & expenses for a featured speaker.

The BSI is moving the slide library from Florida to California. Tinker Massey has done the job of converting the various miscellanious slides into programs for the socities to rent and Carol Johnson made a motion to have her continue to do a slide library for the Florida Council. Carolyn Schoenau seconded the motion. A gift of appreciation is being sent to Tinker for all of the work she has done.

1992 WORLD CONFERENCE- No theme has been set. There will be a photography section of the show in which the photographed plants will be judged. An invitation has been extended to Fla. Council to set a booth at the conference. The conference will be put on by The Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay & The Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies.

Nat DeLeon made a motion to request from the state registrar a list of Florida's judges and how many shows they have judged indicating those judges that need judging credit. Seconded and passed .

This months plant was Aechmea Chantinii donated by Nat DeLeon. Its special qualities are that it was selected 3 generations back for its exceptional banding and coloration. The high bidder was Eleanor Kinzie at \$50.00 and the goats were Carolyn Schoenau & Connie Johnson.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 4:30pm.
