MINUTES OF BUSINESS MEETING HELD JULY 8, 1995, hosted by the Bromeliad Society of South Florida at the home of Rep. Virginia Schrenker.

- 1. Call to order. The meeting was called to order at 1:15 p.m. by Chairman Ed Hall.
- 2. Secretarial Report. The secretarial report had been distributed previously with the Newsletter. The minutes were approved.
- 3. Treasurer's Report: Geoffrey Johnson distributed the Treasurer's report for the quarter. The report was approved.
- 4. Evil Weevil. A copy of the report A PRELIMINARY STUDY OF THE BROMELIADS OF FORTUNA was presented to the Council. It is a report on the search of Dr. Howard Frank and Al Muzzell to find a biological control for Metamasius callizona (The Evil Weevil). The report will be kept with Secretarial information.
- 5. Extravaganza Auction: Chairman Ed Hall distributed his compilation of the rules for the Extravaganza Auction. The motion was made, seconded and carried that these rules be in effect for the Extravaganza (auction) at Leu Gardens in Orlando, September 9. If the rules work smoothly, they will be permanently adopted. Lois Duffey volunteered to hand letter auction number cards. Rules and auction forms will be provided to member societies prior to the Extravaganza.

- 6. World Bromeliad Conference: Carolyn Schoenau & Peggy Nuse reported on the progress of the Conference. The \$130 registration fee will include two meals instead of the usual one, plus all home tours and customary perks of a World Conference. New information will be sent to the Societies' news letters as it occurs.
- 7. Judges School: The second session of the Judges School will be held August 5 in Ft. Myers.
- 8. '95 Extravaganza: Geoffrey Johnson reported that a luncheon will be held at 2 P.M. Saturday Sept. 9 at Leu Gardens in Orlando in the place of the usual dinner. The Auction will begin after lunch and plant sales will be available from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. With this format most society members will not be required to stay overnight. It was moved, seconded and passed that a special mailing of Extravaganza information be funded by the Council.
- 9. Miscellaneous: Carol Johnson was given permission by the Council to send a list of member Bromeliad Societies to The Florida Gardener magazine.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:35 P.M.

This is a tribute to Florida's Tom Lineham, who will finally achieve his desired status as retired Editor of the "Journal of the Bromeliad Society" with the last 1995 November-December issue. He became Editor January, 1984, during the heighth of the regional conflicts in the BSI and has given us, every year, six on-time, flawless Journals, plus countless hours of personal time acting as guide and mentor to out-of-town visitors.

Many do not understand that the position of Editor is not one to declaim or write opposing views, but to select, edit and publish contributions from the membership and experts in the plant field around the world. In selecting articles for publication it is inevitable that toes will be trod upon and egos diminished. I am sure that, after the first couple of issues, Mr. Lineham realized that he had taken upon himself a lonely, thankless job. The occasional error is pounced upon gleefully by the readers.
