

JULY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Ray LeMieux gave an informative, hands-on presentation about propagating bromeliads by seed, techniques for enhancing production of pups, methods for mounting plants on wood, and types of planting media (i.e. soil mixtures) used for terrestrial versus epiphytic bromeliads. Even some of our resident experts present in the audience learned something new from the presentation. Ray has been interested in bromeliads for 15 years, 14 of which have been spent working at TropiFlora Nursery in Tallavast, Florida, where his special interest has been Dyckias and Hechtias and he is now in charge of the succulent section at the nursery. His plant *Dykia reitzii* rubra form, "Snaggletooth", won Best of Show in the recent Sarasota Bromeliad Society show.
